January Program: Marc J Divens, Fisheries Biologist, WDFW, Spokane Valley, WA “Fly Fishing Opportunities for Warmwater Fish in Washington”



Marc plans on a 30 minute presentation on *Fly Fishing Opportunities for Warmwater Fish in Washington* including some information on the history of warmwater fish in Washington, Washington’s Warmwater Fish Management Program, select fly fishing opportunities, and the searchable FISH WASHINGTON database.



Marc started with WDFW’s Inland Fish Program in 1995 working in Olympia as part of the Inland Fish Research Team. In 1999, Marc relocated to Spokane to work as the Lead Fisheries Biologist for the Warmwater Fisheries Assessment Team in Regions 1 and 3. Since that time, he has conducted surveys on over 50 inland waters; worked to develop sampling strategies for

Northern Pike with Kalispel Tribe co-managers; developed guidelines for regulating quality crappie populations; oversaw tiger muskie stocking evaluations; including diet, fish community response, and habitat use; and conducted larval crappie surveys to assess their natural production.

They all went on the trip recently, and had a great time. The jet boat experience was fun, but a little scary—especially when traveling at night. They fished from 7am-9pm, got 3 fish in the boat and lost another 3. It was a very long, but fun day!

Ice Fishing equipment donated by Bruce Frazier was put up for bid—Dave Tharp conducted a fast and furious, auction with Steve Bush submitting the winning bid.

Program Notes:



CFC members, Cliff Swanson, Paul Agidius, Marc Ratzlaff, and Steve Bush, presented the program - *Cutthroat Slam in 6 days, 1600 miles and 3 states.*

Marc Ratzlaff, Steve Bush, Paul Agidius and Cliff Swanson were the guest speakers at the December 2014 meeting. They each took a turn sharing the trip that they took in mid-July in a quest for each one of them to catch at least one of Idaho's four subspecies of Cutthroat Trout.

The adventure began on July 12 as they traveled to the Lochsa River to spend the first night on the trip. Marc and Paul managed to catch a Westslope Cutthroat Trout on this leg of the trip. The next morning after a quick breakfast at the Lochsa Lodge they were off to Southern Idaho and a night's stay on St. Charles Creek. The next morning they got an early start, and by noon each one of the group had caught a Bonneville Cutthroat Trout. The third stop was Palisades Reservoir to camp and fish McCoy Creek, where they each managed to each catch a Finespotted Snake River Cutthroat Trout. After spending two nights here, the next part of the journey took them to the Victor and Driggs, Idaho to primarily fish for Yellowstone Cutthroat trout. Camping in the national forests, in grizzly bear country, was exciting, and made more so when they all had caught a Yellowstone Cutthroat Trout. Back to the Lochsa and camping at Powell; Steve and Cliff caught their Westslope Cutthroat.



The group had as much fun planning, researching and organizing the trip as they had actually completing it. They traveled 3 states, 1610 miles and camped out 6 nights to each catch at least one of Idaho's native cutthroat trout species.

Fly of the Month: Balanced Streamer

Hook: Tiemco 5263 or Mustad 9672 size 8 3XL

Thread: UNI-Thread, 6/0 black

Body: Any dubbing i.e. Ice Dub, black, peacock, golden and olive colors

Rib: Krystal flash, purple

Bead: 5/32" tungsten, color depending on color of fly

Wire "eyes": Rio, Wire Bite, 30 lb

Tail: Marabou, usually black but can be olive



Fly patterns that hang horizontally in the water have become a staple. This includes Washington to North Dakota in the United States and British Columbia to Manitoba in Canada. The Balanced Bead Head pattern was developed before 2005 by Jerry McBride of Deer Lake, WA and published in the 2006 February Fly of the Month. Many times when successful lake anglers are asked "What-are-you-using?" The answer is "Balanced Leech", "Balanced Damselfly", "Balanced etc." This version was tied by Leon Buckles, Spokane, WA. He learned about it from Bob Vanderwater in the Central Alberta Fly Tying Club, Canada. This tying style gives you three options for fishing. It can be suspended from a strike indicator like any other balanced pattern. It can be tied to a leader and retrieved like a traditional leech or nymph. If you want to have a second fly it can be attached to the bottom "eye".
